Book Club Questions for

The Matchmaker's Gift by Lynda Cohen Loigman

- 1. "The Matchmaker's Gift" alternates between Sara and Abby's narratives. Did you feel a stronger connection to one character's perspective? Why?
- 2. Sara works as a matchmaker, while Abby is a divorce attorney. How do these contrasting careers shape the story and the development of the characters?
- 3. Let's discuss Abby's father. How do you think he influenced Abby's life choices and her views on love?
- 4. The story explores the importance of family and intergenerational relationships. How did the relationship between Sara and Abby evolve throughout the book, and what did they learn from each other?
- 5. Cultural and religious elements play a significant role in the story, particularly in the Jewish immigrant community. How did these cultural aspects enrich the narrative, and did they help you better understand the characters' motivations and choices?
- 6. The book combines elements of magical realism with a family saga. How did the inclusion of Sara's matchmaking gift add depth and uniqueness to the story? Did you find it believable within the context of the narrative?

- 10. Consider the statement on page 231, "Tradition should never be used as an excuse to keep people from reaching their potential." In what ways does tradition hinder the characters in the story, and in what ways does it benefit them?
- 11. The story explores the idea of inherited gifts and talents, with both Sara and Abby having unique abilities. How do you think these abilities shaped their lives and the choices they made?

- 12. Sara's matchmaking gift is seen as a threat to the male-dominated profession of matchmaking in her community. How does this aspect of the story shed light on gender roles and expectations during that time? Are there any parallels in today's society?
- 13. The book touches on themes of love, destiny, and choice. Can you identify moments in the story where characters faced choices that significantly impacted their romantic lives? How did they handle these choices?
- 14. In your opinion, what is the most significant lesson or gift that Sara leaves Abby, both in her lifetime and through Abby's reading of her journals?
- 15. Throughout the novel, there's a sense of nostalgia and a connection to the past. How does the author use historical details and settings to create a vivid sense of time and place? Did this enhance your reading experience?
